



Born in Santiago de Compostela, **Ángela Banzas** is one of the leading voices in Galician suspense fiction. With a degree in Political Science and Administration from the University of Santiago and an MBA from the European Business School in Madrid, she soon decided to devote herself exclusively to literature. Her first novel, *El silencio de las olas* (Suma, 2021), was a huge success with the public and in terms of sales. *La conjura de la niebla* was her second novel, and in 2023 she published *La sombra de la rosa*. In 2024, she published the novel *El aliento de las llamas*. With *Cuando el viento hable* she was awarded with Planeta 2025 Prize as a finalist.

“The idea of writing evolved gradually since childhood. When older people opened up to tell stories about the war, the countryside, the sea or emigration, I listened carefully, thinking that all of this should be collected, captured in writing and passed on to posterity. The same people also told me about spirits and holy companions, legends and age-old traditions, and that sparked my imagination. A country in silence. A mystery that still breathes. A post-war family drama.

Sofía is born in the autumn of 1939, after a family tragedy, and grows up surrounded by secrets in the post-war rural Galicia. Her paternal grandparents raise her under strict supervision, while her father, a librarian who lives hidden in the shadows, feeds her imagination with fantastic stories.

She does not understand why her family is hiding her or who is this girl that seems to materialize before her like a hallucination. After being admitted to the Royal Hospital of Santiago, she finds refuge in Julia, her first true friend. There, clandestine corridors and traces of a buried past emerge to reveal new mysteries. And what does this green-eyed young man who has suddenly burst into her life and seems to have so many answers want?

The novel explores the power of imagination in the face of horror, and of love as the last hope. Even in the darkest moments, a great story can save our lives.


The historical setting is one of its greatest attractions, as are the locations: rural areas of Galicia, the Costa da Morte and the Royal Hospital of Santiago. All of them serve as symbolic territories of mystery and beauty.

The author shines with her literary sensitivity thanks to her rhythmic, carefully crafted prose, laden with sensory and metaphorical imagery.

An original approach to the historical trauma of the post-war period, combining the horror of Franco's medical experiments with a poetic, metaphorical and deeply human narrative.



Jorge Díaz, born in Alicante in 1962, has always lived between Madrid and Lisbon. He graduated in Journalism at the Complutense University and since then has worked in television as director and scriptwriter of programmes and series for Spanish and Portuguese channels. He has been coordinator of scripts of such series as Hospital Central and has collaborated in the creation of the series El don de Alba, La Caza Tramuntana, La Caza Monteperdido, Acacias 38 and Victor Ros.

In 2009 he published his first novel, *Los números del elefante*, set in Río de Janeiro in the 1950ies. Then came *La justicia de los Errantes*, with the historical background of the trip of Ascaso and Durruti to South America; *Cartas a Palacio* about the European War Office, a humanitarian office created by King Alfonso XIII during the World War I and finally *Tengo en mi todos los sueños del mundo*, about the sinking of the steam ocean liner, Principe de Asturias.

Since 2018, together with Agustín Martínez and Antonio Mercero, he has been a part of a group of writers who sign their novels with the pseudonym of Carmen Mola. Under this name he published *La novia gitana*, *La red purpura*, *La nena*, *Las madres* and *El clan*. In 2021 they have been awarded the Premio Planeta for the historical thriller *La Bestia*.

Santiago Díaz Cortés (Madrid, 1971), a film and television scriptwriter with a career spanning twenty-five years and nearly six hundred scripts written, published his first novel, **Talión**, in 2018, which won the Morella Negra Prize and the Benjamín de Tudela Prize in 2019. In 2021, **El buen padre** was published, the novel with which she started the series starring the inspector Indira Ramos and which has been translated into several languages. This has been followed by **Las otras niñas** (2022) and **Indira** (2023), the latest instalment in the series and winner of the Alicante Noir 2023 Prize. Santiago Díaz has also successfully cultivated juvenile literature and won the Premio Jaén de Narrativa Juvenil for **Taurus: Salvar la tierra** (2021). In 2024 he published his first historical novel, **Los nueve reinos. Jotadé** (2025) is the first novel of the new crime series, **El amo** is the last novel of the new crime series.

A journalist by education, he worked with Manu Leguineche in the LID and FAX PRESS news agencies and contributed to *La Gaceta de los Negocios* in New York. For over twenty five years he has been scriptwriting television series such as *Hache* (Netflix), *Tramuntana* and *Monteperdido* (TVE), *Seis hermanas* (TVE) and creator of *Hospital Central* (Telecinco) and *Farmacia de guardia* (Antena 3 TV). In the spotlight now is *La novia gitana*, an adaptation of the novel of Carmen Mola, of which he is the coordinator of scripts.

In the field of screenwriting, together with Gracia Querejeta he wrote scripts for *Quince años y un día* (Biznaga Award for the best script at the Málaga Film Festival), *Felices 140* (best script at the Toulouse Film Festival) and *Invisibles*. He wrote the script for *De perdidos al río*, directed by Joaquín Mazón and for two documentary films *La roja, de Brasil a Brasil* and *Tanto monta* about King Ferdinand The Catholic, both emitted on TVE/Spanish Television. Apart from that, he has collaborated in the screenwriting of *La vergüenza* of David Planell and has written short films *Cordelias* and *Como yo te amo*, both of them nominated for Goya.



In all those years, the three authors have been carrying out their personal projects, both in novel and scriptwriting:

Jorge Díaz (Alicante, 1962) is the author of the novels *Cartas al Palacio* and *La Justicia de los errantes*, as well as of the TV series like Hospital Central.

Antonio Mercero (Madrid, 1969) has simultaneously written film and television scripts (Felices 140, Hospital Central, Hache) and has published novels among which are *Pleamar* and *El final del hombre*.

Agustín Martínez (Lorca, 1975) is the creator of the series *Feria*, *La luz más oscura* and *La Caza* (Monteperdido and Tramuntana) and has written the novels *Monteperdido* and *La mala hierba*.

Carmen Mola has been awarded the Premio Planeta de Novela 2021 for the historical thriller entitled *La Bestia*, provoking an international debate about collective writing, the use of feminine pseudonyms in the 21st century and a notable connection between commercial literature and audiovisual contents.
